What is Oma Village?



Oma Village is a family housing site now under construction at 5394 Nave Drive in Novato and set to open in summer 2016. It will offer 14 small, energy-efficient rental homes for families leaving homelessness behind.

The program will be operated by Homeward Bound of Marin, an award-winning nonprofit that operates the bulk of the county's shelter and services for homeless families and individuals.

Who will live at Oma Village?



Families at Oma Village will be people that have thrived in other Homeward Bound programs and are employed or engaged in job-training locally with children in Novato schools. They will meet regularly for action planning and support with our on-site staff.

On-site homework clubs, tutoring and enrichment activities will provide a positive environment for families to help ensure educational success.

How is Oma Village funded?



Homeward Bound has raised \$5.1 million of the \$5.6 million total cost. Contributors include County of Marin, City of Novato, Marin Community Foundation, the Dominican Sisters, Bank of Marin, and a community of generous private donors.
