



Opportunities for Student Volunteer Groups

Homeward Bound of Marin welcomes middle and high school student groups for engaging service-learning experiences that combine community education with meaningful volunteer involvement.

These include organizing a donation drive for essential items like toiletries and bedding, or hands-on activities like making cards for program participants. We host student groups at our main campus in Novato.

A typical visit for student volunteer groups includes:

- A 30-minute presentation introducing Homeward Bound's mission, programs, and impact in the community.
- A 30-minute guided tour of the main Novato campus, providing students with an opportunity to learn about the services offered and the people served.



Groups that organize a donation drive can combine this engaging one-hour visit with delivery of items collected for adults and families experiencing homelessness.

Student groups interested in a hands-on service project can add activities like card-making for program participants. These extended volunteer experiences can last up to three hours and contribute directly to the people we serve.
